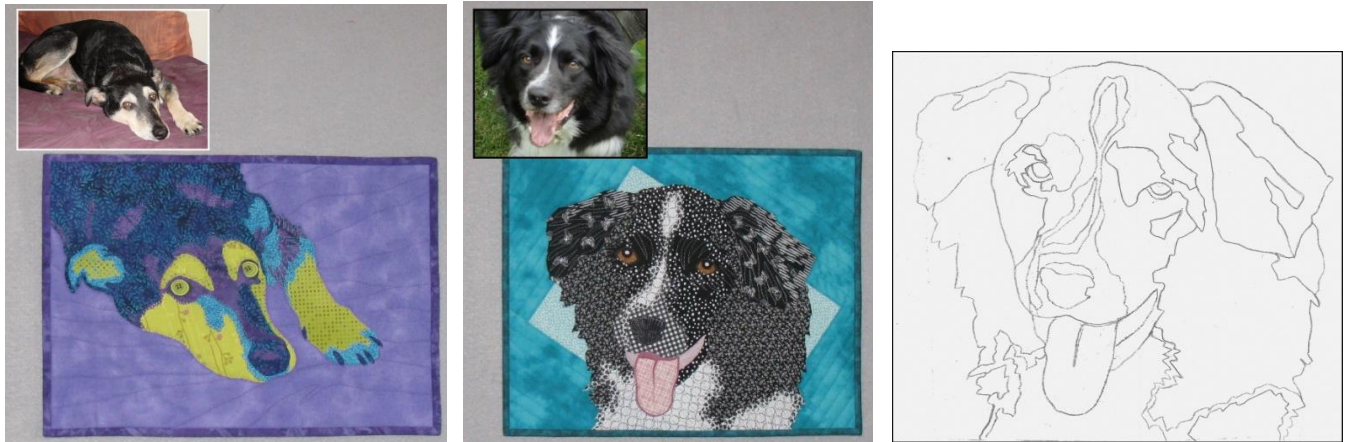


PET PORTRAIT FROM A PHOTO

One-day workshop with Terry Aske



Learn how to create a fused appliqué pet portrait from a favorite pet photo, or use the Border Collie pattern provided.

Terry has designed and created many pet and people portrait quilts using this method. She will bring several of these quilts to the class for inspiration and illustration of the techniques used. She will share with you tips and tricks to make the process easier.

Supply List:

- Original photo of pet – for reference
- Black & white copy of photo – to determine values required
- Full size portrait pattern with all lines drawn in - see my blog for a tutorial <http://www.terryaskeartquilts.com/Studio/tips-tutorials-and-more/create-a-portrait-pattern-from-a-photo/> (or use Border Collie pattern provided)
- Light weight fusible web (Lite Steam-A-Seam or similar)
- Parchment paper (or Teflon pressing sheets – I prefer parchment paper)
- Tracing paper – large enough to cover the pet
- Scissors – fabric and paper
- Scissors – small and sharp for cutting fused fabrics
- Pencil and eraser
- Tweezers or toothpicks (optional) – to move around tiny pieces
- Ultrafine permanent marker – Sharpie or similar
- Light weight stabilizer (I often use fusible dress-making interfacing)
- Fabrics – value is more important than color. Ensure you have values ranging from light to dark. I encourage you to use surreal colors rather than realistic colors – it makes it easier to focus on value
- Sewing machine with ability to do free-motion stitching, accessories, extension cord
- Assorted threads – to match or contrast with your fabrics
- Sewing kit – thread, pins, needles, etc.
- Rotary cutter, ruler, cutting mat
- Sheet or fleece to pin up work in progress and to transport it home
