
WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION: CIRCLES, CIRCLES



Do you love the look of circles in quilts? But are you intimidated by sewing curves? Me too! I use a variety of techniques to create circles that are simple, easy and effective.

The workshop will cover:

an easy method to draw a circle any size

Pular - 12 5 inches square if you have one

- making and using freezer-paper templates
- creating accurate circles using a freezer paper pattern and sewing flat overlapped seams
- circles with raw edges, covered with bias tape (or couching or decorative stitching)
- circles with turned-under edges, which are topstitched in place
- design your own 12-inch square circle block pattern

You will design and make 12-inch blocks using a variety of techniques. The blocks could become a small wall-hanging, a pillow cover, or the start of a larger quilt.

Supply list:

	Eraser (white eraser works best)
	Paper scissors
	Fabric scissors
	Small sharp scissors for trimming close to stitching line
	Rotary cutter and cutting mat
	Stitch ripper
	A selection of coordinating fabrics
	Bias tape – a variety of colors and widths
	(optional) couching material (yarn, embroidery thread, etc.) to use instead of bias tape
	A variety of thread colors (including black) for topstitching bias tape and circles
	Sewing machine and all accessories, extension cord
	(recommended) open toe foot if you have one
	(optional) design wall or fleece to pin up work in progress and to transport it home
